



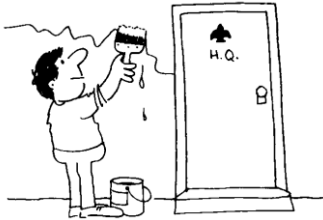

Summer Fair

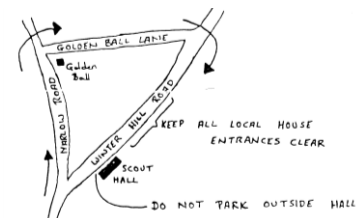

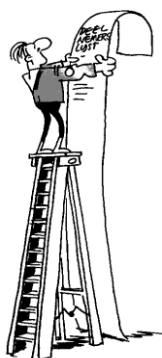
**Drive Past Winter Hill Road; turn right at Golden Ball

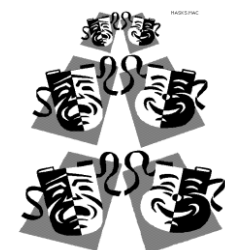
