PG TIPS - PG Tips is the News Letter of Pinkneys Green Scout Group.

The first PG Tips Group Newsletter was produced at the beginning of 1985, after all the Scout Leaders decided at a leaders meeting at our then G.S.L.'s (Nick Hinchliff) house. We were producing different News sheets for each section and items were being duplicated. Parents etc. were asking to have copies of all the news sheets.

August/September 1985 we decided that the Newsletter was working well and that we would hold a competition to choose a Name for it. We had over thirty entries, the judging panel had no choice as "PG Tips" stood out from all the other entries, as it was the only one that had "PG" in the title and as we are known in the local area as PG Scouts it was a good name. (Our Scout Leader submitted the winning entry under a pseudonym).

Simon started to type PG Tips on an old battered typewriter and it was full of composing errors, which made it interesting to read. The only problem we had was to have to pay for the photocopying (nothing changes).

PG Tips is now typed on a computer, which helps with layout, and some reports are now submitted by email. (Simon still manages to get errors in the report – he has the biggest *personal* spell checker **diconary** you could have) We introduced line pictures (cartoons, in 1995). PG Tips is now printed by parents and on Simons Laser Printer the quality is a lot better and we get more information on the page. PG Tips is printed every month - We would like to thank our sponsors for printing it, plus Simon for the copies he does on his printer.

Some interesting facts:

We print 250 copies of PG Tips each month.

Every Beaver, Cub, Scout, Young Leader & Leader gets their own copy. (Stop disagreements)

We send out over 150 copies to friends of the Group. (Goes around the world, from Canada to Australia / New Zealand to Hungary)

We have got a permanent record of event/activities including reports written by the boys, parents! and friends!

PG Tips has saved the Group a lot of money, with all the items

that we have asked for FREE! Everything from computers to Ice Cream Containers.

It also keeps every one up to date with future events/activities So NO ONE has an excuse that they didn't know something was going to be held.

Maidenhead 2000 is a special District Camp, where all Cubs, Scouts, Ventures in the UK will be camping over the same weekend, Friday 26th May to Monday 29th May 2000. PG Cubs, Scouts, Ventures & Leaders will be joining other Cubs, Scouts, Ventures, Brownies, Guides & Rangers from all over Maidenhead. The Camp is split into four sub camps PG is a member of the **Columbia Sub Camp** (Named after a space craft), with two other Scout Groups and three Guide companies, under the leadership of our Scout Leader Simon. The cost for the weekend for Cubs, Scouts & Ventures is £29, and Beaver who will be visiting either on Saturday 27th May or Sunday 28th May is £5. The youngsters will have a very active programme; they will be able to take part in a large range of activities. 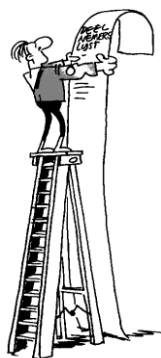

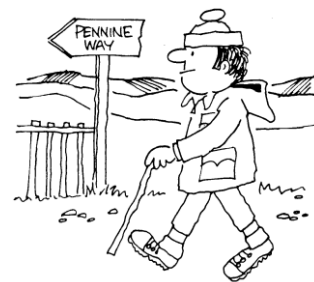
Troop Camp

Word Jamboree to Sweden 2011

Reminder that Berkshire Scouts is seeking 36 participants to form a Jamboree Unit to attend the next World Scout Jamboree, to be held in Sweden in 2011. As a Jamboree Unit member, you will have the time of your life. You'll work together during the seventeen months prior to the Jamboree, creating one cohesive unit ready to travel to Sweden.

The last Jamboree four PG Scouts got places - if you would like to talk to one of them please let me know

The World Scout Jamboree takes place every four years and the 22nd Jamboree will take place in Sweden in July and August of 2011. Four thousand people from the UK will join over 30,000 others from all over the World for an experience that will live with them forever.

To be eligible participants must have been born on or between **25 July 1993** and **27 July 1997** which means that candidates will currently be either Scouts or Explorer Scouts (aged around 12½ to 16 now). All applicants will be invited to a selection weekend to be held on 6-7 March 2010 at which the 36 unit members will be selected. Other than age there are no rules for who can apply ; it is open to EVERYONE Scouting in Berkshire!
