


SAFELY DROPPING OFF TO MEETINGS

CUB NEWS

Littlewick Pack

At the time of writing, we've started the new term, kicking off with the basics - an introduction to Cub Meetings. Here's a bit of information about what an 'ordinary' cub meeting looks like...

Cubs arrive and usually play a join in game until the register is taken, then Akela or another leader calls 'Pack Pack Pack' to begin the opening ceremony. Every meeting opens with The Grand Howl: a ceremony inspired by The



Jungle Book by Rudyard Kipling. In the book, a wolf pack's meetings begin with everyone circling their leader Akela (pronounces ah-kay-lah) and howling – this is their Grand Howl. In Cubs, the Grand Howl gathers everyone together and helps them focus. By talking about 'doing your best', it also helps everyone remember their Promise.

Every week, the cubs are inspected in their Sixes (the groups the cubs are split into). Throughout the cub meeting, the cubs get the opportunity to gain 'points' towards winning the termly Pack Trophy Award and inspections are the first opportunity in the meeting to gain some points. All cubs are expected to attend in uniform including a white handkerchief in their pocket.

Once the duty Sixers (the leader of the groups of cubs known as Sixes) breaks the flag, the pack salut and the meeting commences. The main games and activities are usually linked to progression through the badge programme.

At the end of the meeting, there's usually a game to finish and the closing ceremony follows a similar routine to the opening ceremony, with the lowering of the union flag being at the end.

The term ahead is packed and we're pleased to be getting back to some normality.
