We need your support; it is quite simple to access our online web shop,



SCOUT NEWS

HALF TERM – Running Cubs Activities on the Green

We are looking for help from Scouts running Cubs Wednesday during half term. 15th February 5.45pm – 8pm. We will be setting up an assault course on the green and a blind trail in the woods, plus Matchstick Puzzle.

If you are not away at half term, and not doing anything and can help (All Scouts can help). You will need to wear your uniform, waterproof coat & boots, plus bring pair shoes to wear in hall.

For our first meeting of the year we ran through different first aid scenarios. We split into groups and one scout had to act out an injury. The rest of the team then discussed what was wrong and what they would do.

> A couple of each team had a first aid guide to look up what the correct answer was. We also did an arm sling tying relay.

> For our second meeting of the term we played a game based around world trade. Scouts were teamed up to represent 6 countries which were split into 3 levels of trading power. They had to manufacture goods (shapes cut out of paper) to earn money, with the most successful winning. However the resources (paper), tools (scissors, measuring equipment) and knowledge (understanding how to earn bonus points) was shared unevenly depending on each country's respective level of trading power. To succeed the scouts had to negotiate trade between each other, with very few rules imposed by the leaders, but they quickly found out the uneven levels of power strongly affected what each country could or could not do. At the end we discussed what everyone experienced and how they felt about being part of an unfair game/system.
