### **Devizes to Westminster Canoe Race**





Rob Ayre, PG Leader and John Boothman, Cookham leader, completed Devizes to Westminster, 125 mile Canoe Race

The race began at Devizes in Wiltshire, travelling down the Kennet and Avon canal to Reading and then the River Thames to Westminster, finishing opposite the Houses of Parliament. It took place over the Easter weekend they completed the paddle, in 22 hours and 46 minutes, **winning the trophy for the fastest Scout Team**.

They were competing against over 300 boats, the race was a severe test of skill, physical and mental stamina which included stopping at over 70 places, where the paddlers have to get out for locks and carry their own boat. The weather was not very good they had torrential downpours and strong winds of up to 45mph

They completed the gruelling course with help from their support crew of twelve, who fed them and filled their water bottles as they ran along the tow path at the locks. They set off at 8.45am on Easter Saturday and paddled until Easter Sunday morning, placing


### Littlewick Colony
