


Anytime between Tuesday morning (Weds only before 5.30pm, Thurs before 4.30pm and after 6pm) and Fridays before 5pm.

2024 Berkshire Scouts Project Africa

I'm Victor Wilson, I am 16 years old young leader at Winter Hill Scouts, and I will be going on Project Africa next summer in 2024. This is a group of about 70 young people between 14 and 18 and 30 leaders.

Recent complications have meant that unlike previous Project Africa trips, we will be going to Malawi instead of Uganda. However, the work will be roughly the same; making bricks; building schools; painting informational murals. We will be working with local communities that are linked to the charity Joshua in central Malawi, about 4 hours from the main airport.

The group going on Project Africa have already met to do various team building exercises like putting up tents, solving a treasure hunt and researching and building the animals that we will expect to see, as well as participating in a webinar where concerns about the location of Project Africa were resolved. It will cost me £3700 though and I am planning on fundraising the amount. My parents and other helpful people have already organised a silent disco and future quizzes.
