A big thank you goes to all the parents who have taken home a black sack of rubbish after their child's s section meeting. We have to pay to have rubbish collected and this helps us save some money.


If you have space in your black Wheelie bin or you are going to the tip, and you see a black rubbish sack, please help us by taking it.

#### Winter Hill Pack
