The closing ceremony all members renewed their promises. A collection was taken for *Thames Valley Adventure Playground*, which raised £350.




SAFELY DROPPING OFF TO YOUR CHILD'S MEETINGS

Please give it to a leader, so it can go in the second-hand uniform box.


Younger Siblings
