
Last month all members of PG, had the chance to take part in this years International Jamboree On the Internet (JOTI), which we held at the hall.



SAFELY DROPPING OFF TO MEETINGS



Park on the Scout Hall side of the road, facing Furze Platt Road, parking lights on when it is dark


Do Not Park in the driveways of Flint Lodge, Christmas Cottage or Pond House
