



SCOUT NEWS

PLs & APLs Training Weekend

The PLs and APLs from both Littlewick and Winter Hill Scouts attended at weekend at the Scout hall.

They had team building exercises to complette as well as planning the joint camps we are holding later this year. Scouts from both Troops will be attending these camps in mixed patrols made up from PLs, Apls and Scouts from both Troops. They spent a couple hours in the evening playing cards, which they do at lot of at Summer camp, before watching a film and going to sleep. They also cooked all the meals.

For one meeting the scouts split into small groups and we did 6 bases split into two rounds on different common injuries and what the correct first aid response should be. These were how to approach an incident, cuts, burns, unconsciousness, choking and asthma.

The following week was the meeting closest to Shrove Tuesday so we made pancakes. Gas burners or electric hobs were set up around the hall and by the end of the meeting there was quite the production line of pancakes going.





The final meeting in this period was split in two. For one half the scouts prepared a hike route and the other half they did an activity to educate them about the affects and harms of drugs and alcohol. At this meeting we also presented *Daisy* with her Chief Scout's Gold Award. Well done *Daisy*.

Outside of normal meetings, some of the scouts spent a Sunday morning helping alongside the work party at Woolley Firs nature reserve. They were doing some hedge laying and the scouts could

learn about this and help remove much of the excess growth which was then burnt. Thanks to BBOWT for having us along.

Winter Hill Troop

We started last month by with the Scouts in patrols building a structure (bridge) to get a member of their patrol from one side of the Scout Hall to the other using wooden staves. The Friday after shove Tuesday the Scouts had a pancake evening and managed to cook some very good pancakes. The following week, the Scouts did basic first aid were taught bandaging as well as the recovery position and resuscitation, using a *Resusci Annie*, CPR doll.
