

Over fifty members of both Troops, will be going on summer camp this year, the last two weeks in July, Due to problem this year with finding drivers for the minibuses, we have changed where we are going. We are now going to a field in Oxfordshire.

Littlewick Troop

This run of meetings started with the scouts filming safety videos for general hazards when pitching tents. This covered lifting heavy things, taking care of others when carrying poles, trip hazards and suitable footware. The scouts acted out both good and bad scenarios. Some considerable care was taken to ensure the bad scenarios were just acting! We are waiting for a rainy meeting to edit these videos together.





The following meeting, the scouts built basketball nets from pioneering poles and other items from the hall and then we played a large game of netball (the grass was not conducive to basketball). After this we had a meeting in the woods where the scouts built shelters.

For our most recent meeting we tried the coke an Mentos experiment. The Mentos cause the carbon dioxide in the

coke (or similar) to be released much faster and therefore you get a fountain. We experimented with the mixtures and it seems the key thing is to get the Mentos into the coke as soon as it is opened.
