




GROUP NEWS October 2025


SAFELY DROPPING OFF TO MEETINGS



Visit http://jotajoti.info / to find out more. **JOTI** is an annual event when Scouts and Guides all over the world make contact with each other by means of the Internet. It is a real Jamboree during which Scouting experiences are exchanged and ideas are shared, thus contributing to the world brotherhood of Scouting. **JOTI** is world-wide event mainly for Scouting groups of all ages.

We use, Internet chat, Web site browsing and E-mail to exchange messages with Scouts in countries all over the world (Over 200 Countries take part) we do not manage to make contact with all these countries, but we do normally manage to talk to and contact

Scouts from about 21 different countries.


